THE SOLIDARITY PROGRAMME IS INTENDED FOR ATHLETES ONLY; APPLICATIONS FOR TEAM OFFICIALS WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY REJECTED.

IFSC Funds

The IFSC allocated an overall budget of €15,000 to support athletes' travel or other expenses for a maximum of €750,00 per country. The funds will be transferred directly onto the athletes' bank accounts after the end of the 2019 World Championships and, in any case, only if the selected athletes competed in the 2019 World Championships.

Funds will be allocated according to the following continental distribution; in the occurrence that more than one athlete from the same NF enter the programme, the funds must be split equally:

Asia	€ 3,500
Europe	€ 3,500
Oceania	€ 1,500
Pan-America	€ 5000



Accommodation

The Japan Mountaineering and Sport Climbing Association, host of the 2019 IFSC Climbing World Championships, will provide **free accommodation to six (6) male and six (6) female athletes** for the duration of the whole event:

- Check in: 10 August 2019
- Check out: 22 August 2019

Athletes will be accommodated in shared twin rooms at the [Toyoko Inn Keio-sen Hashimoto-eki Kita-guchi](#).

Athletes refusing to share the room with other teams will not be eligible for the Solidarity Programme.

Upon availability of the facility, it may be possible to have an extended reservation, however any extra days will not be considered as part of the Solidarity Programme, and shall not be covered by JMCSA. All expenses for any extra days shall be borne by the national federation of the athlete in question.

Rooms will be allocated according to the following continental distribution:

Application Process

IFSC Member Federations are invited to send applications for a maximum of two (2) athletes, 1 male and 1 female, to administration@ifsc-climbing.org by and no later than **Wednesday 19th June 2019**.

Applications must contain:

- Complete application form for each athlete, signed and sealed by the Federation
- Athlete's CV or details on the athlete's current situation (national ranking, major achievements, etc.)
- Athlete's cover letter
- Any other relevant document

Selection Process

The IFSC Office will collect the applications and submit them to the relevant Continental Council. The Continental Councils will make the selection according to the above-mentioned continental quota and respecting a number of criteria, including evaluation of the status of the NF.

The Continental Councils will report to the Executive Board and the final list of athletes will be published after the Executive Board approval, by the end of June 2019.
