



IFSC WORLD CUP CHONGQING 2016

COXSEY REPEATS, RUSSIA AND JAPAN CROWD PODIUM

Russia won both Speed contests, Japan snagged three medals and Shauna Coxsey of Great Britain extended her World Cup winning streak to four on Sunday.

Chongqing, China, once again did not disappoint at the third Bouldering World Cup and first Speed World Cup of the 2016 season. On April 30th-May 1st, electric fans of sport climbing again flocked to Southwest China to witness spectacular performances by the world's best climbing competitors.

Coxsey Remains Unbeaten in 2016

Only a handful of female Bouldering athletes have won Gold in four consecutive events, and Coxsey joined this elite group last weekend with her third victory of the season. The previous woman to do so was champion Akiyo Noguchi in 2014, who took five more attempts than Coxsey to top three problems at Chongqing. Her Japanese teammates Miho Nonaka and Mei Kotake also placed well, finishing third and fourth, respectively.

On the men's walls, nineteen-year-old Tomoa Narasaki picked up another medal for Japan and the first Gold of his World Cup career by sending three problems. Top-ranked Jan Hojer competed in his first finals round of the season and topped two problems for Silver. Jongwon Chon of Korea and Kokoro Fujii of Japan settled for third and fourth, respectively, after requiring more attempts to complete their two problems.

Familiar Faces in Speed Contests

Dmitrii Timofeev last won a World Cup in 2012 at Chongqing by racing to the top nearly a second faster than the strong Libor Hroza of the Czech Republic. This year, the Russian speed climber defeated Hroza yet again when his contestant twice miscued at the starting marks. Record-holder Danyil Boldyrev of Ukraine posted a whopping 5.87 in the Bronze medal match after missing out on the finals by a mere fraction of a second.

For the women, current record-holder and top-ranked Luliia Kaplina also brought home Gold for Russia by climbing one-and-a-half seconds quicker than Klaudia Buczek of Poland in the final set. Buczek's teammate, Aleksandra Rudzinska, slipped past Purnamasari Ita Triana of Indonesia in a nail-biting consolation match to round out the podium.
