Inzai After-Competition Report – 27-28 October 2012

IFSC Lead World Cup: Favourites strike again in Inzai

In the last out of three East Asia competitions the current leaders of the Lead Overall World Cup, Mina Markovic (SLO) and Ramón Julian Puigblanque (ESP), celebrated two victories for favourites in Japan last weekend.

It was a more than thrilling event for spectators and athletes in the Inzai Matsuyamashita Park Sports Arena: In the half-final Mina Markovic, later winner of the women's competitions, missed the top after place 1 in the second qualification and made her way into the finals just with rank seven. In the following round the winner of the IFSC Lead World Cup 2011 showed a stunning performance and gained her second victory of the season. Places two and three went to Korea's Jain Kim (winner of the last World Cup in Mokpo and leader after the semifinal) and Markovic's compatriot Maja Vidmar. Austria's Johanna Ernst, 3rd after the semi, dropped to fourth, followed by local heroine Momoka Oda.

In the men's competition Spain's routinier Ramón Julian Puigblanque obtained another optimum performance in this year's World Cup season and reconquered his leading position in the overall calculation with victory number three in Inzai. Silver and bronze went to Julian Puigblanque's competing candidates in the Lead World Cup, reigning world champion Jakob





Schubert from Austria and former WC leader Sachi Amma (JPN). Second runner-up in the overall calculation, Sean McColl from Canada, finished 7th in Japan. The leading four in the 2012 Lead calculation are now separated by less than 100 points – so action is bound to occur!

The ninth and last decision in this year's IFSC Lead World Cup will be made on Kranj (SLO) on November 17th–18th. Closing a three-week regeneration pause for teams and athletes, the final competition in Slovenja will also crown the world's best Lead climbers in 2012.
