

IFSC BOULDERING WORLD CUP VAIL 2013: DMITRII SHARAFUTDINOV: BACK TO THE TOP IN VAIL!

The Russian athlete wins gold and ensures the first overall World Cup victory of his career during the IFSC Bouldering World Cup in Vail, Colorado. Serial winner Anna Stöhr climbed to her sixth victory out of seven competitions.

Back in the game, back to the top - Russian's currently most successful climber was indisputably the strongest last Saturday in Vail. Right before the final Kilian Fischhuber, winner of the BWC Toronto one week ago, was leading the men's competition after a strong performance in the semis.

But the final round celebrated Russian athletes: Dmitrii Sharafutdinov and his compatriot Rustam Gelmanov were the only finalists topping out three out of four final boulder problems. A performance enabling Dmitrii Sharafutdinov to win gold in Vail (last bouldering competition but one) and at the same time the IFSC Bouldering Overall World Cup 2013! Silver and bronze in Vail went to Rustam Gelmanov and Jorg Verhoeven, both still fighting with Jakob Schubert, Guillaume Glairon Mondet, Kilian Fischhuber and Sean McColl for the second place in the Overall ranking.

Anna Stöhr - what else?

In the women's competition, climbing fans attended another breathtaking final. If qualifications were just a formality for Anna Stöhr and Akiyo Noguchi (five flashes on five problems), semi-finals were more than challenging with only three women managing to top out. The American finals turned out to be a war of nerves for Austria's early overall champion. Akiyo Noguchi, Anna Stöhr's eternal rival, was leading after the first three problems with three flashes. During the last problem Stöhr and local heroine Alex Puccio cached up with the scoring. Finally two bonus attempts less for Anna Stöhr ensured the Austrian serial winner gold in Vail while Noguchi and Puccio won silver and bronze.

The final showdown of the IFSC Bouldering World Cup 2013 will follow after a short Bouldering summer break on August 24-25 at the Olympic stadium in Munich, Germany.
